

B. The **SIN-BEARING** of the **SERVANT** of the **LORD**. (vss 4-6)

1. According to vs 4a, what did **JESUS** (the Messiah) do with our griefs and sorrows?

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2. In vs 4b, what is the problem?

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\* **EVERYTHING** happens for **A REASON** and **GOD** brings **REASON** out of **EVERYTHING** that **HAPPENS**. (Phil. 1:6; 2:13)

3. In vs. 5, the literal Hebrew meaning of the word “**WOUNDED**” means to be **PIERCED THROUGH**.

4. Why was **CHRIST WOUNDED**?

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\* The fact that **CHRIST** was wounded for our **TRANSGRESSIONS** clearly points to the doctrine of the **SUBSTITUTIONARY ATONEMENT**.” (2 Cor. 5:21)

\* It takes **HUMILITY** to acknowledge that **CHRIST** mercifully took the **PUNISHMENT** that we deserved. (1 Pet. 5:5,6)

5. In the latter part of vs 5, By **HIS STRIPES** we are **HEALED**” is the **PROVISION** for **HEALING** found in the **SUFFERING** of **JESUS**. (Matt. 8:16,17; 1 Pet. 2:24,25)

6. These words in vs 6 “**ALL WE LIKE SHEEP HAVE GONE ASTRAY**” clarifies so crystal clear “**WHY WE NEED A SAVIOR**.”

\* We have **ALL** turned to our **OWN PATH** rather than **FAITHFULLY FOLLOWING** our **SHEPHERD**. (Rom. 1:16-20; 3:10-12,23)

\* But like a **GOOD SHEPHERD**, our **SAVIOR** has given **HIMSELF** for us that we might **LIVE**. (John 10:11)

“We don’t have to continue the path of **WALKING** in **SIN** and **SHAME** when **GOD** has provided **A NEW PATH**. (Rom 6:1-4)
